Situation in Central African Republic II *The Prosecutor v. Maxime Jeoffroy Eli Mokom Gawaka* ICC-01/14-01/22

Updated: 17 March 2022

Suspected of war crimes and crimes against humanity allegedly in various locations in the Central African Republic (CAR) between at least 5 December 2013 and at least December 2014. Surrendered to the International Criminal Court (ICC) on 14 March 2022.

Charges

- Crimes against humanity: (attempted) murder, extermination, deportation or forcible transfer of population, imprisonment or other severe deprivation of physical liberty, torture, persecution, enforced disappearance and other inhumane acts; and
- War crimes: (attempted) murder, torture, cruel treatment, mutilation, intentionally directing an attack against the civilian population, intentionally directing an attack against personnel, installations, material, units or vehicles involved in a humanitarian assistance, intentionally directing an attack against buildings dedicated to religion, pillaging, enlistment of children under the age of 15 years and their use to participate actively in hostilities, displacement of the civilian population and destroying or seizing the property of an adversary.

Key judicial developments

OPENING OF THE INVESTIGATION

On 30 May 2014, the Government of the CAR referred the situation in the CAR since 1 August 2012 to the Court. The situation reportedly involved alleged crimes committed by both the Seleka and the Anti-Balaka. On 24 September 2014, the ICC Prosecutor opened an investigation in relation to this situation.

WARRANT OF ARREST

The warrant of arrest against Mr Mokom was issued under seal on 10 December 2018.

SURRENDER

On 14 March 2022, Mr Mokom was surrendered to the International Criminal Court by the authorities of the Republic of Chad. He is currently in ICC custody.

INITIAL APPEARANCE

The initial appearance of Mr Mokom is scheduled for 22 march 2022 before Pre-Trial Chamber II. During the first appearance, the Chamber will verify the identity of the suspect, and ensure that he was clearly informed of the charges he is alleged to have committed and of his rights under the Rome Statute of the ICC in a language he fully understands and speaks. The judge will also announce the next steps in the proceedings.
