In the appeal of the Prosecutor against the decision of Pre-Trial Chamber II entitled "Decision pursuant to article 18(2) of the Statute authorising the Prosecution to resume investigation" of 31 October 2022 (ICC-02/17-196),

In light of the "Notice of discontinuance of the appeal of the Prosecutor against the 'Decision pursuant to article 18(2) of the Statute authorising the Prosecution to resume investigation' (OA5)" of 16 January 2023 (ICC-02/17-207),

*Issues* the following

## ORDER

The legal representatives of the participating victims and the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan may file responses to the Prosecutor's notice of discontinuance of the appeal, not exceeding 10 pages, by 16h00 on 3 February 2023.

## REASONS

1. On 16 January 2023, the Prosecutor filed, pursuant to rule 157 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence, a notice of discontinuance of the appeal against the Pre-Trial Chamber II's decision of 31 October 2022 (hereinafter: "Notice of Discontinuance").<sup>1</sup> The Prosecutor submits that he has decided to discontinue the appeal "in the interests of judicial economy, and mindful of the Court's limited resources" while maintaining "its position that the investigation is not limited in the way described in paragraph 59 of the Decision – in light of the fact that the issue was definitely settled by the Appeals Chamber in its judgment of 5 March 2020".<sup>2</sup> The Prosecutor further submits that the discontinuance of the appeal "is without prejudice to further litigation of this matter

[...] if the parameters of the situation and the scope of the Court's jurisdiction were to be put in issue in the future".<sup>3</sup>

2. The Appeals Chamber recalls that, following an order of the Appeals Chamber,<sup>4</sup> the legal representatives of the participating victims, and the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan, filed their respective responses to the Prosecutor's appeal brief on 14 and 15 December 2022.<sup>5</sup> Given these circumstances and in the interests of justice, the Appeals Chamber finds it appropriate to allow the legal representatives of the participating victims, and the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan, to file observations on the Notice of Discontinuance. The observations, not exceeding 10 pages, shall be filed by 16h00 by 3 February 2023.
