## THE REGISTRAR of the International Criminal Court ("the Court");

**NOTING** the referral of the situation in Darfur, Sudan to the Prosecutor of the Court on 1 July 2002 by the United Nations Security Council in resolution S/RES/1593 of 31 March 2005:1

**NOTING** the public redacted version of the Decision on the Prosecutor's Application under article 58 relating to Abdel Raheem Muhammad Hussein ("the Decision"), dated 1 March 2012;2

NOTING the Warrant of Arrest for Abdel Raheem Muhammad Hussein issued by Pre-Trial Chamber I ("the Chamber") on 1 March 2012;3

NOTING articles 13 (b), 57 to 60, 66, 67, 87, 89, 91, and 97 of the Rome Statute ("the Statute"), rules 117, 176, 178, 184, 187 and 196 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence ("the Rules") and regulations 31 and 111 of the Regulations of the Court;

**CONSIDERING** that the United Nations Security Council decided that "the Government of Sudan and all other parties to the conflict in Darfur, shall cooperate fully with and provide any necessary assistance to the Court and the Prosecutor pursuant to this resolution and, while recognizing that States not party to the Rome Statute have no obligation under the Statute, urges all States and concerned regional and other international organizations to cooperate fully";4

**CONSIDERING** that in the Decision, the Chamber recalled that the obligations of the Government of the Republic of the Sudan, pursuant to United Nations Security Council resolution 1593, to cooperate fully with and provide any necessary assistance

to the Court, prevail over any other obligations that the Republic of the Sudan may have undertaken pursuant to any other international agreement;<sup>5</sup>

**CONSIDERING** that the Chamber also recalled that if the Government of the Republic of Sudan continues to fail to comply with the above-mentioned cooperation obligations with the Court, the competent Chamber, pursuant to article 87(7) of the Statute, "may make a finding to that effect" and decide to "refer the matter [...] to the Security Council" to take appropriate measures pursuant to the United Nations Charter;<sup>6</sup>

**CONSIDERING** that article 89(1) of the Rome statute provides that the Court may transmit a request for the arrest and surrender of a person to any State on the territory of which that person may be found;

**CONSIDERING** that the Chamber requested the Registry to (a) prepare a request for cooperation seeking the arrest and surrender of Abdel Raheem Muhammad Hussein and containing the information and documents required by article 89(1) and 91 of the Statute and rule 187 of the Rules of procedure and Evidence; and (b) transmit such request, in accordance with rule 176(2) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence, to the competent Sudanese authorities;

**REQUESTS** the Sudanese authorities to arrest and surrender the following person to

the Court:

**REQUESTS** the Sudanese authorities to comply with the procedures provided for in articles 59, 89(2) and 89(4) of the Statute and rule 117 of the Rules;

**REQUESTS** the Sudanese authorities to notify the Court of any application made under articles 59(3) and 89(2) of the Statute;

**REQUESTS** the Sudanese authorities to inform the Court, pursuant to article 97 of the Statute, of any problem which may impede or prevent the execution of this request;

**REQUESTS** the Sudanese authorities immediately to inform the Registry when the person sought by the Court is available for surrender pursuant to rule 184 of the Rules;

**ATTACHES** to this request, in accordance with articles 87(2) and 91(2) of the Statute and rule 187(1) of the Rules, the following documents:

- a copy of the original of the arrest warrant;
- a picture of Abdel Raheem Muhammad Hussein;

- two copies of the arrest warrant in Arabic, one for the Sudanese authorities and one for the person subject to the arrest warrant;
- a copy of the relevant provisions of the Statute in Arabic, the language that the person subject to the arrest warrant fully understands and speaks.
