Issues the following

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1) The Central African Republic and
 - a) the victims represented by Ms Marie-Édith Douzima-Lawson;
 - b) the victims represented by the Office of Public Counsel for Victims pursuant to Trial Chamber III's 9 December 2009 *Decision on the Observations on legal representation of unrepresented applicants* (ICC-01/05-01/08-651);

may submit their observations on Mr Jean-Pierre Bemba Gombo's document in support of the appeal and on the Prosecutor's response within ten days of the notification of said response or, if no response is filed, upon expiry of the prescribed time limit.

- 2) The Legal Representatives of the Victims have the obligation to specify the pseudonyms of the victims whom they represent in these proceedings.
- 3) Mr Jean-Pierre Bemba Gombo and the Prosecutor may each file a single response to the observations referred to at paragraph one within five days as from the notification of the latest observations or, if no observations have been filed, upon expiry of the prescribed time limit.
