1. The Government of Libya hereby files English and Arabic versions of article 318 of the Libyan Criminal Code:

Article (318) Sedition between Factions

Any person who publicly incites to the hatred of a group(s) of people or to scorn it by any way that breaches public order, shall be punished by imprisonment for a period not exceeding one year, and a fine ranging from twenty to one hundred pounds or either penalties.

مادة (318) إثارة الفتنة بين الطوائف كل من حرض علانية على بغض طائفة أو طوائف من الناس أو الإزدراء بها بشكل من شأنه أن يخل بالأمن العام يعاقب بالحبس مدة لا تجاوز سنة وبغرامة تتراوح بين عشرين جنيها ومائة جنيه أو بإحدى هاتين العقوبتين.

- 2. This is the only provision referred to in its Admissibility Challenge pertaining to Abdullah Al-Senussi filed on 2 April 2013¹ which has not already been provided to the court in previous filings arising from the Saif Al-Islam Gaddafi admissibility proceedings.
- 3. The Government also continues to rely upon the English and Arabic versions of Libyan laws filed on 28 May 2012² and 11 February 2013³ which were referred to in its Admissibility Challenge pertaining to Saif Al-Islam Gaddafi of 1 May 2012⁴ and its Supplemental Submissions of 23 January 2013.⁵


