**TRIAL CHAMBER II** (“the Chamber”) of the International Criminal Court, acting pursuant to article 75 of the Rome Statute and regulation 35 of the Regulations of the Court (“the Regulations”), issues the following decision:

1. On 9 February 2016, the Chamber instructed the Trust Fund for Victims (“the TFV”) to supplement the draft implementation plan submitted on 3 November 2015<sup>1</sup> (“the Order of 9 February 2016”). The Chamber instructed the TFV to prepare a file for each potential victim and to transmit a first batch of files to the Chamber by 31 March (“the first batch of files”), a second batch by 15 July and a third batch by 31 December 2016.<sup>2</sup>

2. On 23 March 2016, the TFV filed a request, under regulation 35 of the Regulations<sup>3</sup> (“the Request”), for an extension of the time limit for the submission of the first batch of files. The TFV submitted that, owing to the complexity of the task, it was not in a position to transmit the first batch of files to the Chamber by 31 March 2016.<sup>4</sup> In particular, the TFV noted the difficulties in organising joint missions with the Legal Representatives of victims (“the Legal Representatives”) in the field<sup>5</sup> and in developing a file format – together with the Victims Participation and Reparations Section (“VPRS”), the Office of Public Counsel for Victims and the Legal Representatives – that included a consent form for the victims, meeting the criteria set out by the Chamber and compatible with the VPRS database.<sup>6</sup> The TFV also informed the Chamber that the newly-elected TFV Board of Directors would be holding its first annual meeting from 18 to 21 April 2016 and that the instant case would be discussed at the meeting.<sup>7</sup>

3. The TFV submitted that, in the light of the above-mentioned difficulties, it needed an extension of two months to transmit the first batch of files to the Chamber<sup>8</sup>.

4. The Chamber recalls that, having regard to the first sentence of regulation 35(2) of the Regulations, a chamber may extend a time limit if good cause is shown. In the instant case, in the light of the reasons given by the TFV, the Chamber considers that there is good cause to extend the time limit for the submission of the first batch of files by two months.
