#### **Prosecution's Submissions**

- 1. Pursuant to Trial Chamber VI's ("Chamber") 27 May 2016 Supplemental decision on matters related to the conduct of proceedings,1 the Office of the Prosecutor ("Prosecution") submits its revised time estimates for the list of witnesses who will be called at trial. In Annex A, the Prosecution has indicated the revised expected duration of each Prosecution direct examination. The Prosecution estimates the total remaining witness examination time to be 388 hours. This estimate includes the time projected for direct and cross examination, with the assumption that the Defence will use approximately the same amount of time as the Prosecution. The estimate does not include time that the Chamber may grant to the Legal Representatives of Victims or time that the Chamber may use to question witnesses.
- 2. As directed by the Chamber, the Prosecution has reduced the aggregate time estimate by approximately one quarter. The revised time estimates of the remaining Prosecution witnesses have been reduced by 65 hours of Prosecution examination time. As outlined in Annex A, the Prosecution proposes submitting the prior recorded testimony of several witnesses under rule 68. In order to expedite the trial, the Prosecution will continue to monitor the progress of the presentation of Prosecution evidence and look for further opportunities to reduce time estimates. Bernada
