Request for Leave to Present Additional Authority

1. At the conclusion of the oral hearing on the article 81 appeals in this case,¹ the Appeals Chamber invited the Parties and participants to make additional written observations, which the Parties and participants filed on 19 January 2018.² With these submissions, the appeals were fully briefed.

2. After filing these additional submissions, a respected academic journal on international criminal law published a paper on superior responsibility under article 28 of the Rome Statute. This paper is directly relevant to one of the issues arising from Mr Bemba's appeal against the Trial Chamber's Judgment under article 74, and may therefore assist the Appeals Chamber in deciding on that aspect of the appeal. This paper was not previously available to the Parties since it was only placed online in "April 2018".

3. The Prosecution requests the Appeals Chamber—acting under its discretionary power under regulation 28 of the Regulations of the Court—to permit the Prosecution to file, without any accompanying arguments, details of this supplementary authority to the "Prosecution's Response to Appellant's Document in Support of Appeal".³ Authorising this request would be consistent with the prior practice of the Appeals Chamber.⁴
