### I. BACKGROUND

1. On 26 February 2020, the Defence for Mr Gbagbo filed a request seeking a page extension to 130 pages for its response to the Prosecution's appeal brief (the "Defence Request").<sup>1</sup>

2. On the same day, the Appeals Chamber issued an Order providing that any response to the Defence Request shall be filed by 28 February 2020.<sup>2</sup>

3. On 27 February 2020, the Prosecution filed its Response to the Defence Request.<sup>3</sup>

### II. SUBMISSIONS

4. The Common Legal Representative concurs with the arguments raised by the Prosecution in its Response. Accordingly, without repeating said arguments, she submits that none of the reasons identified by the Defence demonstrate exceptional circumstances justifying the requested extension of pages, as required by regulation 37(2) of the Regulations of the Court.

5. In this regard, the Common Legal Representative also agrees with the Prosecution that the Defence's interpretation of regulation 63(3) of the Regulations of the Court is incorrect.<sup>4</sup>

6. Moreover, the Common Legal Representative notes that the reasons identified in the Defence Request – namely, the challenge to certain factual finding of the Trial Chamber and the novel questions raised by the appeal – are not exceptional in nature. On the contrary, they are clearly foreseeable when dealing with appeal proceedings before the Court.

FOR THE FOREGOING REASONS, the Common Legal Representative respectfully requests the Appeals Chamber to reject the Defence Request. Should the Chamber nevertheless grant the Request, she respectfully asks that the number of pages for her subsequent submissions be equally extended to 90. Indeed, in accordance with the instruction of the Chamber, the filing of said submissions will constitute the only opportunity for the Common Legal Representative to address the interests of the victims she represents, while the parties will be able to file further observations subsequently.
