#### I. Introduction

1. Pursuant to Trial Chamber IX's ("Chamber") instruction conveyed by email of 14 September 2021 ("Instruction"), 1 the Registry hereby submits a request for access to a number of Prosecution documents deemed relevant for the Registry's mapping exercise ("Mapping exercise") ordered by the Chamber on 6 May 2021 ("Order") in the present case of *The Prosecutor v. Dominic Ongwen* ("Case").

## II. Procedural History

- 2. On 6 May 2021, the Chamber issued its Order by which it, *inter alia*, instructed the Registry, with the assistance and cooperation of the Legal Representatives of Victims as appropriate, to undertake a comprehensive mapping of direct and indirect victims potentially eligible for reparations in the Case, identifying: *i*) the main categories of victims; *ii*) their current location; and *iii*) all data that it may be able to obtain regarding the victims' gender, age group, and particular vulnerabilities which may need to be taken into account by the Chamber when deciding on the reparations to be awarded.<sup>3</sup>
- 3. By email of 10 September 2021, the Registry's Victims Participation and Reparations Section ("VPRS") requested authorization from the Chamber to have access to a number of documents from the Office of the Prosecutor ("OTP"), considered relevant for the Mapping exercise; it also sought guidance from the Chamber on whether a formal request should be submitted on the record of the Case ("Request").4

4. On 14 September 2021, the Chamber instructed the Registry to file the Request by way of a formal filing. It directed the parties and participants to file their responses, if any, within five days of notification of the Request.<sup>5</sup>

## II. Applicable Law

5. The present filing is submitted in accordance with the Instruction.

### III. Request

- 6. In August 2021, the VPRS met with the OTP who identified a series of documents on the record of the Case potentially containing information relevant for the Mapping exercise. According to the OTP, not all of these materials were previously submitted into evidence in the record of the Case, but they were included in the OTP disclosure to the Defence.
