Côte d'Ivoire: Signature of a Four-Party Agreement on the Suppression of the Zone of Confidence

The joint chiefs of staff of Defense and Security Forces of Cote d'Ivoire (FDS-CI), the Armed Forces of the New Forces (FAFN) and the commanders of the United Nations Operation in Cote d'Ivoire and Licorne forces signed Wednesday an agreement to eliminate the Zone of Confidence as of midday Monday, April 16.

The ceremony took place during a quadripartite meeting at ONUCI's headquarters in Abidjan.

Following the meeting, ONUCI's Force Commander, General Fernand Amoussou, announced the establishment April 12 of a technical commission to continue working on the modalities of implementing the document.

General Amoussou earlier congratulated the two Ivorian parties for seriously engaging in a process leading to the signature of the agreement.

Military leaders at the meeting also adopted the concept of an imaginary "green line" replacing the Zone of Confidence and delineated by 32 points corresponding to villages and towns in the region.

The impartial forces will be installed in 17 observation posts across this green line to assure the security of peoples and goods in the zone. Mixed FAFN and FDSCI patrols, supported by the impartial (ONUCI and Licorne) forces, will gradually take control of police and gendarmerie functions in the zone.

The military leaders also discussed the integrated command center of mixed (FDSCI and FAFN) units which will be deployed in the zone.
