**We, the undersigned, prominent women of Aveba,**

**Declare on our word of honour:**

We believe that there would be no problem were GERMAIN KATANGA to return to the Congo, specifically to Ituri, be it to Aru, Aveba or elsewhere.

We would be very glad to see him in person as he was of great use to the community.

We are absolutely certain he will not rejoin the militia.

Were GERMAIN KATANGA to be released today, he would not join the militia because they do not have the same ideas; his presence, however, could help to end the war. He might convince them to stop fighting.

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GERMAIN KATANGA could be of use because he could raise awareness against rape. Before, when he was in charge in Aveba, there were no rapes; rapes were severely punished. At present, rapes are being committed by militia and soldiers.

We are sure he has become wiser. And he would be of greater use to the community, who need him, in view of the great sacrifice he made for the community at the time. In short, this man is of great use to the community.

These days associating with the Hema poses no problem; we see and meet each other day and night.

Hema women sell oil for vegetables in Aveba.

We, Ngiti and Hema, meet in church. For example, we attend church in Bogoro without any problems.

There are also Bira here.

The communities live in harmony.

We, the undersigned, confirm that the content of this statement reflects what we believe to be true. The statement was made voluntarily under no threat or pressure. We understand that the statement is taken by persons who represent GERMAIN KATANGA, who was convicted by the International Criminal Court. We also understand that it may be used in judicial proceedings before the International Criminal Court, in particular proceedings on the early release of GERMAIN KATANGA.
