The Embassy of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan to the Netherlands presents its compliments to the Registry of the International Criminal Court (ICC), and with reference to the latter's Note Verbale NV/2017/EOSS/049/JCA/ms dated 21 February 2017 concerning the request for cooperation in the case The Prosecutor v. Omar Hassan Ahmad Al Bashir (ICC-02/05-01/09) has the honor to convey the following:

- The 28th Arab League summit will be held in Jordan on 29 March 2017 pursuant to the decision of the Arab League.
- Invitations to attend the Summit were delivered to the Heads of State of the members of the Arab League by the respective Jordanian ministers.
- The former Deputy Prime Minister for Economic Affairs, Dr. Jawad Anani, delivered the invitation for participation in the Summit to the President Omar Hassan Al Bashir, of the Sudan on 9 January 2017.
- On 19 March 2017, the Embassy of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan in Khartoum received a Note Verbale from the Foreign Ministry of the Sudan applying for visas for President Al Bashir and the accompanying delegation to attend the Summit.
- The Sudanese government has registered its delegation for the Summit on the website of the Arab League Summit. The registration includes President Al Bashir.
- No official confirmation from the Sudan concerning the attendance of President Al Bashir has yet been received by the Jordanian government.

- The Jordanian authorities have yet to be informed about the itinerary for the arrival and departure of President Al Bashir to Jordan.

Furthermore, Jordan adheres to its international obligations, including those the applicable rules of customary international law, while taking into account all its rights thereunder.

The Embassy of The Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Registry of the International Criminal Court the assurances of its highest consideration.
