Dear Trial Chamber X,

The Prosecution was alerted by the Defence that the name of [REDACTED] was inadvertently left unredacted in the metadata of [REDACTED] summary [REDACTED]. This document was disclosed to the Defence on [REDACTED] in [REDACTED].

The Prosecution seeks the Chamber's authorisation to re-disclose [REDACTED] to the Defence after applying the proper redaction to [REDACTED] name that was inadvertently disclosed, and to instruct CMS to remove from eCourt this document that contains the inadvertent disclosure and replace it with the newly disclosed document with the proper redaction.

Consistent with the Protocol on the handling of confidential information (ICC-01/12-01/18-674-Anx2), the Prosecution confirmed to the Defence the inadvertent nature of this disclosure to ensure that the item containing the inadvertent disclosure is not distributed within the team or to the accused and that any digital or printed copies of this document are destroyed. The Legal Representatives were also contacted to that effect.

The Prosecution will also inform VWS to ensure that the inadvertent disclosure concerning [REDACTED]'s identity does not affect his security.
