- 1. On 7 December 2021, the Common Legal Representatives of Victims (the 'CLRV') filed observations regarding the protocols to be adopted in the case. As an alternative request, the CLRV called for the adoption of a protocol on dual status individuals. The parties had no objections to the adoption of such a protocol. ²
- 2. On 22 February 2022, the CLRV provided a list of witnesses who have dual status as victims in the case. It suggested the adoption of similar procedures as adopted in the *Al Hassan* and *Yekatom & Ngaïssona* cases.³
- 3. Bearing in mind the concerns addressed by the CLRV and the practice of various trial chambers, the Chamber finds that the dual status witness protocol adopted in the *Yekatom & Ngaïssona* case which generally follows the protocols in the *Ongwen* and *Al Hassan* cases shall apply in this case.⁴
- 4. Accordingly, the Chamber hereby issues the dual status witness protocol adopted for the proceedings.
