Submission

1. Pursuant to the Sixth decision on matters related to the conduct of proceedings: end of

Defence case, potential rebuttal/rejoinder evidence, and closure of evidence ("Decision"),

instructing the Prosecution to submit a preliminary request on potential rebuttal

evidence,1 the Prosecution hereby informs Trial Chamber X ("Chamber") that at this

stage, it does not intend to seek the Chamber's leave to present rebuttal evidence.

2. The Prosecution nevertheless notes that the Defence case is still ongoing and that

there are still several Defence witnesses whose evidence is yet to be presented *viva voce*

or introduced pursuant to rule 68(2) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence. The

Defence is also expected to submit bar table motions by 24 October 2022.² Depending

on further evidence presented during the remainder of the Defence case, the

Prosecution may consider it necessary to request leave to present rebuttal evidence.

3. The Prosecution therefore reserves the right to submit such a request one week

after the Defence notification of the conclusion of its evidence presentation, as

envisaged in the Decision.³
