I. Introduction

 The Registry submits the present report ("Registry Report") and its two annexes consisting of a confidential version of items recognized as evidence formally submitted and its public redacted version, pursuant to the "Directions on the conduct of proceedings" ("Directions"),¹ issued on 4 October 2021 by Trial Chamber I ("Chamber").

II. Procedural History

- 2. On 4 October 2021, the Chamber issued its Directions, in which it directed the Registry to: "[...] *reflect all formally submitted items in the eCourt metadata* [...]", and to "[...] *submit reports for each witness who testifies, indicating which items have been formally submitted by the parties and participants in relation to that witness. The email exchanges* [...] *are to be annexed to this filing, applying redactions as appropriate*".²
- 3. On 22 July 2022, the Office of the Prosecutor ("Prosecution") called its twentyeighth witness. After the conclusion of the examination of witness P-0932, parties formally submitted items used during the hearings as instructed in the Directions.
- 4. On 17 August 2022, the Chamber issued the decision on items of evidence recognised as formally submitted for witness P-0932 via email.³ Pursuant to the Directions, the Registry was instructed to apply redactions as appropriate to the emails enclosed in Annex 1 to the filing.
