

1. The Common Legal Representative of Victims ('CLR') notes the "Prosecution's second request to submit material from the bar table"¹ (the "Second bar table motion").
2. The Second bar table motion contains items requested to be submitted into evidence ("Submitted items"), identified in Annex A and grouped into eight categories, namely: Reports; Media Articles; Legislation; Government of Sudan Interview with the Accused; Material Seized from the Accused; Photographs; Audio/Visual Material and Related Documents; and a Map Book.
3. The CLRV advises that she has no objection to the Submitted items, and that in the CLRV's view the Prosecution has adequately and sufficiently justified the *prima facie* reliability, relevance, and probative value of the Submitted items, as well as identified how the Submitted items will assist in the Chamber's determination of the truth in the case. Furthermore, the Submitted items do not negatively impact on the interests of the participating victims.
