I. Introduction

1. The Registry submits with the present report and annex one, the public redacted versions of items recognised as formally submitted for witness MLI-OTP-P-0602, pursuant to the "Decision on the conduct of Proceedings" ("Decision"),¹ issued on 6 May 2020 and to the "Third decision on matters related to the conduct of proceedings" ("Third Decision"),² issued on 4 September 2020 by Trial Chamber X ("Chamber").

II. Procedural History

- 2. On 6 May 2020, the Chamber issued its Decision in which it directed the Registry to: "[...] reflect all formally submitted items in the eCourt metadata [...]", and to "[...] submit reports for each witness who testifies, indicating which items have been formally submitted by the parties and participants in relation to that witness. The email exchanges [...] are to be annexed to this filing, applying redactions as appropriate".3
- 3. On 4 September 2020, the Chamber issued its Third Decision which further established that:

"8. [i]n relation to formal requests for the submission of evidence used during a hearing, and pursuant to paragraph 34(ii) to (v) of the Directions on the Conduct of Proceedings, the Chamber will issue an email decision identifying the items recognised as being formally submitted evidence.

9. Pursuant to paragraph 34 (vi) of the Directions on the Conduct of Proceedings, the Registry shall submit a filing per witness comprising a cover filing and an Annex. The cover filing shall contain the list of the items considered formally submitted by the Chamber, with their evidence reference numbers (the 'ERN'). In the Annex, the Registry shall include the above email decision of the Chamber which will contain also any relevant email submissions of the parties. The Annex will be redacted as indicated above for email decisions."⁴

4. On 27 May 2021, the Chamber communicated by email its decision ("27 May 2021 Decision") Decision on material recognized as being formally submitted for P-0602.⁵

III. Submissions

5. In order to enable the parties and participants to suggest redactions, the Registry followed the procedure specified in paragraph 6 of the Third Decision. Therefore, on 17 November 2021 the Registry initiated the consultation process with the parties and participants requesting them to provide the agreed redacted annexes and further recalling that any disagreements or objections on specific redactions should be directly addressed to the Chamber with the Court Officers in copy.

6. On 23 June 2022, the Single Judge instructed the Registry to proceed with the filing of the Quarterly Report, submitting in the public record of the case the redacted versions of the email decisions annexed to the various Registry
