I. INTRODUCTION

1. The Common Legal Representatives of the Victims of the Other Crimes and the Common Legal Representative of the Former Child Soldiers (jointly the "CLRV") hereby submit their joint response to the "Consolidated Defence Request for an Extension of Page and Time Limits".¹

2. The CLRV do not oppose a modest extension of five pages for the Ngaïssona Defence appeal briefs against the decisions of Trial Chamber V allowing the formal submission of prior recorded testimony pursuant to Rules 68(2)(c) and (d) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence.² Concerning the extension of the time limit, the CLRV support the Prosecution's position for a limited extension of time by one week. Should the Appeals Chamber grant the request, the CLRV ask equal page and time extensions for their response thereto.

II. CONFIDENTIALITY

3. Pursuant to regulation 23*bis*(2) of the Regulations of the Court, the present submission is filed confidential, following the classification chosen by the Ngaïssona Defence. However, the CLRV indicate that the submission can be reclassified as public.

III. SUBMISSIONS

4. The CLRV support the Prosecution's position concerning the page limit of the appeal brief to be filed by the Ngaïssona Defence, agreeing that a modest extension is adequate in the circumstances given the novelty of the issue under appeal.³ Indeed, as also underlined by the Prosecution,⁴ the Ngaïssona Defence fails to properly substantiate the requested extension for 15 pages.

5. Concerning the extension of the time limit, the CLRV equally support the Prosecution's position for a modest extension of time by one week, in light of the Defence's upcoming deadline regarding its presentation of evidence together with the recent Court's system constraints.

6. Should the Appeals Chamber grant the request, the CLRV respectfully ask equal page and time extensions for their response to the Ngaïssona Defence appeal briefs. They indicate in this regard that their response will be a joint submission.
