PRE-TRIAL CHAMBER II of the International Criminal Court issues this 'Decision regarding the "Observations écrites des victimes sur le retrait des charges portées contre Maxime Jeoffroy Eli Mokom Gawaka".

- 1. On 17 October 2023, following the Prosecution's 'Notice of Withdrawal of the Charges against Maxime Jeoffroy Eli Mokom Gawaka' ('Mr Mokom'), the Chamber terminated the proceedings against Mr Mokom (the '17 October 2023 Order').
- 2. On 1 November 2023, the Legal Representatives for Victims (the 'LRVs') filed the 'Observations écrites des victimes sur le retrait des charges portées contre Maxime Jeoffroy Eli Mokom Gawaka', thereby asserting that: (i) the Prosecution failed to comply with its obligation to inform the victims; (ii) the Prosecution's decision to withdraw the charges is not justified; (iii) the decision to withdraw the charges has severe consequences for the victims; (iv) the harm suffered by the victims justifies the intervention of the Trust Fund for Victims through its assistance mandate; and (v) the Registry should grant the LRVs a transitional period to allow them to properly inform the victims already admitted in the proceedings (the 'LRVs Observations').³
- 3. On 27 November 2023, following an order from the Chamber,⁴ the Registry explained that, upon the LRVs' request, it had extended the remuneration for the LRVs' activities pertaining to the present case for a certain period (the 'Registry Report').⁵
- 4. At the outset, the Chamber recalls that, pursuant to the 17 October 2023 Order, the proceedings against Mr Mokom have been terminated. The termination of the proceedings *ipso facto* brought an end to the LRVs' mandate in the present proceedings.

Therefore, the Chamber finds that the LRVs lack standing to submit the LRVs Observations and, accordingly, dismisses *in limine* the LRVs Observations.

5. As to the LRVs' remuneration, the Chamber observes that the LRVs do not request any specific relief from the Chamber. The Chamber nonetheless takes note of the Registry Report and acknowledges the appropriateness of the extension of the LRVs' remuneration for the sole purpose of allowing the LRVs to inform the victims having participated in the present proceedings of the 17 October 2023 Order. The Chamber does not consider it necessary to address this matter any further.

FOR THESE REASONS, THE CHAMBER HEREBY

FINDS that the LRVs lack standing to submit the LRVs Observations and **DISMISSES** *in limine* the LRVs Observations;

NOTES the extension of the LRVs' remuneration for the sole purpose of informing the victims having participated in the present proceedings of the 17 October 2023 Order; and

ORDERS the Registry to either request that the Registry Report (ICC-01/14-01/22-300-Conf-Exp) be reclassified as confidential or to submit a confidential redacted version of the Registry Report by no later than 5 December 2023, as well as to submit a public redacted version in due course.
