THE PRESIDENCY of the International Criminal Court notes that on 15 November 2023, the Defence for Mr Ngaïssona filed appeals against the 'Decision on the Prosecution Request for Formal Submission of Prior Recorded Testimony pursuant to Rule 68(2)(d) of the Rules' and the 'Third Decision on the Prosecution Requests for Formal Submission of Prior Recorded Testimonies pursuant to Rule 68(2)(c) of the Rules' in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Alfred Yekatom and Patrice-Edouard Ngaïssona* (the '*Yekatom and Ngaïssona* case').¹

On 11 March 2024, Judge Tomoko Akane became a member of the Appeals Division, in accordance with article 39(1) of the Rome Statute of the International Criminal Court (the 'Statute').²

On 13 March 2024, Judge Akane requested, pursuant to article 41(1) of the Statute and rule 33(1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence (the 'Rules'), that the Presidency excuse her from her function as a judge of the Appeals Chamber for the purposes of all pending and future appeals in the *Yekatom and Ngaïssona* case (the 'Request for Excusal').

The *ad hoc* Presidency notes article 41(1) of the Statute whereby '[t]he Presidency may, at the request of a judge, excuse that judge from the exercise of a function under this Statute'.

On 14 March 2024, the *ad hoc* Presidency granted the Request for Excusal (Annex I).

The *ad hoc* Presidency notes the composition of the Appeals Chamber as set out in article 39(2)(b)(i) of the Statute, pursuant to which the Appeals Chamber shall be composed of all of the judges of the Appeals Division which in turn is composed of the President and four other judges, by virtue of article 39(1) of the Statute. It is further noted that rule 38 of the Rules provides for the replacement of judges for objective and justified reasons, including accepted excuse, and that pursuant to regulation 15 of the Regulations, the Presidency is responsible for the replacement of judges.

Noting the availability and the current and anticipated workload of the judges of the Court, the *ad hoc* Presidency hereby decides to temporarily attach Judge Kimberly Prost, currently assigned to the Trial Division, to the Appeals Chamber to replace Judge Tomoko Akane for the purpose of hearing pending and future appeals in the *Yekatom and Ngaïssona* case.

Accordingly, the Appeals Chamber shall be composed as follows for any such appeals:
