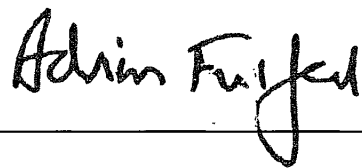

Trial Chamber I ("Trial Chamber" or "Chamber") of the International Criminal Court ("Court" or "ICC"), in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Thomas Lubanga Dyilo*, delivers the following Order on the transmission of 7 new victims' applications and the submission of observations:

1. On the 3 March 2011, the Registry submitted the Sixth Report to Trial Chamber I on Victims' Applications under Regulation 86(5) of the Regulations of the Court containing 7 new victims' applications to participate in the *Lubanga* case.¹
2. In accordance with Rule 89(1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence, the Chamber instructs the Registry to transmit these applications, suitably redacted under Article 68(1) of the Rome Statute, to the prosecution and defence for observations by **14 March 2011**. Before transmission to the parties, the legal representatives currently representing the 7 victims, Mr Keta and Mr Diakiese, are to be consulted to ensure that the redactions are limited to those strictly necessary for security reasons.
3. The prosecution, the defence and the legal representatives currently representing the applicants are invited to submit observations by **5 April 2011**.

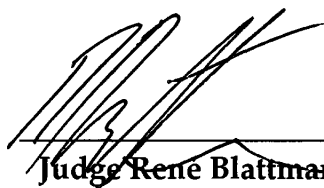
