### **Prosecution's Report**

- 1. In the "Decision Regarding the Non-Disclosure of 116 Documents Collected Pursuant to Article 54(3)(e) of the Rome Statute", the Single Judge ordered the Prosecution to submit a report every two weeks on the status of the documents obtained under article 54(3)(e) of the Rome Statute ("Statute") that are to be disclosed to the Defence.
- 2. On 3 February 2014, the Prosecution filed its first report ("First Report") as ordered,<sup>2</sup> and it hereby submits its second report.
- 3. On 7 February 2014, the Prosecution disclosed to the Defence 14 documents from one provider in their redacted form as approved by the Single Judge.<sup>3</sup> Lifting of restrictions for those documents was reported in the Prosecution's First Report.<sup>4</sup>
- 4. Since its First Report, and as part of its on-going consultations, the Prosecution has had further contact with two providers and expects a response concerning lifting of restrictions from at least one of them before Friday 21 February 2014 and is awaiting a response from the other.

5. The status of disclosure remains unchanged from the Prosecution's First Report: lifting of 54(3)(e) restrictions was obtained for 48 documents: (a) 36 documents out of the 172 identified as containing information falling within the provisions of rule 77, and (b) 12 documents classified as incriminating.
