1. The Prosecution opposes the Mangenda Defence's request for extension of the time and page limits for filing the document in support of its appeal against the Single Judge's decision denying Mangenda interim release ("Request").<sup>1</sup>

2. Since the page limit extension sought is unlimited, it should be dismissed *in limine*. Alternatively, by broadly alleging that the appeal engages "*des questions de droit fondamentaux*" and "*la matière* [...] *complexe*" without more, the Defence fails to meet Regulation 37(2) of the Regulation of the Court's "exceptional circumstances" threshold. On the contrary, appeals of decisions on provisional detention have routinely been filed by Defence teams at this Court within the 20-page limit. Further, the Single Judge's decision was not exceptionally long or complex.<sup>2</sup>

3. The Prosecution also opposes the Defence's four-day request for an extension of the time limit to file the document in support of its appeal. It offers no reason why Regulation 35(2) of the Regulation of the Court's "good cause" requirement is met, and should be dismissed for this reason alone.
