## Prosecution's Report

- 1. In the "Decision Regarding the Non-Disclosure of 116 Documents Collected Pursuant to Article 54(3)(e) of the Rome Statute", the Single Judge ordered the Prosecution to submit a report every two weeks on the status of the documents obtained under article 54(3)(e) of the Rome Statute that are to be disclosed to the Defence.
- 2. On 3 and 18 February, 5 and 20 March, 4 and 22 April, 7 and 22 May 2014, the Prosecution filed its first, second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth reports respectively, as ordered.<sup>2</sup>
- 3. The status of disclosure remains unchanged since the Prosecution's eighth report. To date, the Prosecution has obtained lifting of restrictions for the following documents: (a) 141 documents out of the 171 identified as containing information falling within the provisions of rule 77, and (b) 100 documents classified as incriminating.
- 4. The Prosecution continues to consult with the providers to obtain their consent to the lifting of restrictions imposed on the remaining documents.
