**Trial Chamber V(A)** (the 'Chamber') of the International Criminal Court, in the case of *The Prosecutor v William Samoei Ruto and Joshua Arap Sang*, pursuant to Articles 64(6)(f) and 64(10) of the Rome Statute, renders this Order on Consultations with the Kingdom of the Netherlands.

- On 27 November 2014, the defence for Mr Ruto (the 'Ruto Defence') submitted the 'Ruto Defence Request for Consultation with the Dutch Authorities pursuant to Articles 93(3) and 97' (the 'Request').<sup>1</sup>
- 2. On that same date, the Chamber, via e-mail, directed the Registry to immediately transmit the Request to the relevant authorities of the Kingdom of the Netherlands (the 'Dutch Authorities') and invited them to file written observations and attend a hearing on Tuesday, 2 December 2014 at 14:30.2 The Chamber now sets on the record this direction in Annex A to this filing.
- 3. On 28 November 2014, the defence for Mr Sang (the 'Sang Defence') made an application to join the Request.<sup>3</sup>
- 4. On that same date, the Prosecution filed its observations on the Request.4
- 5. On 2 December 2014, the Chamber received the observations from the Dutch Authorities to the Request.<sup>5</sup>
- 6. On that same date, the Chamber held a hearing in which the representatives of the Dutch Authorities and the parties made oral submissions on the Request.<sup>6</sup>

7. On 3 December 2014, the Dutch Authorities submitted their additional observations to the Request.<sup>7</sup>

8. On 5 December 2014, the Chamber heard further oral submissions from the parties in relation to the Request.<sup>8</sup>

9. On that same date, the Chamber, via e-mail, rendered further directions on the consultation with the Dutch Authorities. The Chamber now sets on the record these directions in Annex B to this filing.

10. On 10 December 2014, the Prosecution transmitted to the Chamber, via e-mail, the response received from the Dutch Authorities. <sup>10</sup> The Chamber now sets on the record this response in Annex C to this filing. The Dutch Authorities request the complete version of the Chamber's directions, as well as the transcripts of the hearings of 2 and 5 December 2014, in order to 'be able to consider further consultations' related to the Request.

FOR THE FOREGOING REASONS, THE CHAMBER HEREBY

**DIRECTS** the Registry to prepare redacted versions of the transcripts of 2 and 5 December 2014, containing the relevant parts of the discussions related to the Request, and notify these to the Dutch Authorities;

**INVITES** the Dutch Authorities to respond to the Chamber's directions of 5 December 2014 no later than 12:00 on Thursday, 18 December 2014.
