Prosecution's Report

1. In the "Decision Setting the Regime for Evidence Disclosure and Other Related Matters",¹ the then Single Judge ordered the Office of the Prosecutor ("Prosecution") to submit a monthly progress report on the status of documents affected by article 54(3)(e) of the Rome Statute. The Prosecution hereby submits its first report.

2. On 28 January 2015, the Prosecution informed the Single Judge during a status conference that article 54(3)(e) restrictions applied to 6,219 documents, amounting to 46,973 pages.² The Prosecution also informed the Single Judge that one information provider responsible for 1,801 documents, amounting to 8,506 pages, had already provided written consent to lift article 54(3)(e) restrictions.³

3. Following this update, an additional four information providers, responsible for 4,098 documents totalling 37,670 pages, have provided written consent to lift article 54(3)(e) restrictions. This means that, to date, article 54(3)(e) restrictions have been lifted on 5,899 documents, amounting to 46,176 pages.

4. The Prosecution continues to seek consent from information providers for the 320 documents, amounting to 797 pages, that remain subject to article 54(3)(e) restrictions. In this regard, on 23 March 2015, the Prosecution contacted one information provider and expects a response concerning the lifting of restrictions shortly.
