TRIAL CHAMBER II ("the Chamber") of the International Criminal Court, acting pursuant to article 85 of the Rome Statute ("the Statute") and rule 174 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence ("the Rules"), issues the following decision.

- 1. On 27 February 2015, the Appeals Chamber rendered its judgment confirming, by majority, the decision of Trial Chamber II dated 18 December 2012 acquitting Mathieu Ngudjolo.¹
- 2. On 14 August 2015, Counsel for Mathieu Ngudjolo ("Counsel") filed a request for compensation pursuant to article 85 of the Statute² ("the Request for Compensation").
- 3. On 18 September 2015, in accordance with the Chamber's order,³ the Prosecution filed Request for Compensation⁴ response to the ("the Prosecution's Response").
- 4. On 24 September 2015, Counsel requested the leave of the Chamber to reply to the Prosecution's response pursuant to regulation 24(5) of the Regulations⁵ ("the Request").
- 5. On 25 September 2015, the Prosecution filed a response to the Request in which it requested that the Chamber dismiss the Reply.⁶
- 6. The Chamber notes that, in accordance with rule 174 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence, "[a]ny observations by the Prosecutor shall be notified to the person filing the request". The rule does not, however, provide for the right to reply as such. Nevertheless, the Chamber considers that a reply should be authorised and ordered.

7. The Chamber underscores that the reply must be strictly limited to the points raised in the Response and may not be used to strengthen the arguments put forward in the Request for Compensation.

FOR THESE REASONS, the Chamber

GRANTS the Request;

INSTRUCTS Counsel to file a reply of no more than 10 pages to the Prosecution's Response, by 16 October 2015, to be strictly limited to the points raised by the Prosecution.
