## Introduction

1. On 24 January 2012, Pre-Trial Chamber I (the “Pre-Trial Chamber”) ordered the Registry’s Victims Participation and Reparations Section (the “VPRS”) to report every three months on the applications received in the Situation in Libya;<sup>1</sup>
2. The Registry hereby submits its seventeenth periodic report in the Situation in Libya covering the period from 25 January 2016 to 24 April 2016.

## Applicable Law

3. The Registry submits the present report in accordance with articles 68(1) and (3) of the Rome Statute, rules 16(1) and 89(1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence and regulation 86 of the Regulations of the Court.

## Submission

4. The Registry notes that there have been no new developments since the Registry’s tenth periodic report on applications received in the Situation in Libya (the “Tenth Periodic Report”).<sup>2</sup> Therefore, the information presented in the Tenth Periodic Report remains unchanged.
5. The Registry takes note of the passing away of Mr John RWD Jones QC who represented one applicant in this situation. The Registry will take the necessary steps to determine if another legal representative will take over the representation of his client in the proceedings.
