#### I. Introduction

1. The Office of the Prosecutor ("Prosecution") has received information about [REDACTED] to Witness CAR-OTP-PPPP-0178 ("Witness 178") and Witness CAR-OTP-PPPP-0169 ("Witness 169"). The Prosecution submits this report on these [REDACTED] in accordance with the Single Judge's order of 14 August 2009 to continuously assess the risk to the safety and well-being of the witnesses.

## II. Request for confidentiality

2. The Prosecution requests that this submission be received by the Trial Chamber III ("Chamber") as "Confidential, *Ex Parte*, Prosecution and Victims and Witnesses Unit only" as it contains information that should not be disclosed to the Defence.

#### III. Prosecution's submissions
