- 1. On 10 August 2016, the Prosecution filed a "Request to Obtain Financial Information from the Registry" ("the Request").¹ The Prosecution requested the Chamber to direct the Registry to provide it with financial information concerning the total cost of the trial in the Main Case,² and information concerning the costs incurred by the Registry in relation to the 14 witnesses who are the subject of the charged offences in the Related Case.³
- 2. On the same day, the Chamber invited the Parties to submit their responses by 18 August 2016.⁴
- 3. The Defence for Mr Kilolo objects to the Request of the Prosecution. The Defence contends that the Request is premature and in violation of article 67(1) of the Rome Statute.
- 4. As the matter is pending, the Request of the Prosecution is therefore premature, especially as no date has been set thus far for the pronouncement of the verdict.
- 5. Further, the Prosecution advances contradictory arguments for submitting the Request at such an early stage in the trial. Indeed, while claiming that it wishes to avoid any unnecessary delay,⁵ the Prosecution subsequently contradicts itself by stating that the Registry would not be overburdened in providing the requested information within a reasonable time.⁶
- 6. Furthermore, the Defence opines that to grant the Request of the Prosecution would imply that the Accused are guilty, in violation of article 66 of the Rome Statute.
- 7. In these circumstances and in the absence of a judgment, the Defence reserves the right to subsequently present observations on the admissibility and relevance of the information, should the Chamber grant the Request of the Prosecution.
