Pre-Trial Chamber I (the "Chamber") of the International Criminal Court issues this decision on withdrawal of counsel.

- 1. On 12 May 2017, the Registry informed the Chamber that Karim Khan ("Mr Khan") had been appointed as counsel for Saif Al-Islam Gaddafi ("Mr Gaddafi") and Dato' Shyamala Alagendra ("Ms Alagendra") was appointed as associate counsel in this case.¹
- 2. On 26 April and 6 July 2018, respectively, the Registry informed the Chamber that also Essa Mbye Faal and Aidan Ellis had been appointed as associate counsel for Mr Gaddafi in this case.²
- 3. On 13 July 2018, the Chamber received the "Lead Counsel's Request Pursuant to Regulation 78(1) of the Regulations of the Court" (the "Request"), in which Mr Khan seeks the Chamber's leave to withdraw from the representation of Mr Gaddafi.³ He submits that his recent appointment as the "United Nations Special Advisor and Head of the Investigative Team established pursuant to Security Council Resolution 2379 (2017)" do not allow him to continue the representation of Mr Gaddafi.⁴ He also advises that Ms Alagendra, hitherto associate counsel, be appointed as lead counsel.⁵
- 4. The Chamber notes article 67(1)(d) of the Rome Statute (the "Statute"), regulation 78 of the Regulations of the Court and articles 8, 15(2), 17(2), 18(3) and 19 of the Code of Professional Conduct for counsel (the "Code of Conduct").

- 5. The Chamber, noting counsel's wish to withdraw and the reasons given therefore, hereby grants the Request. Whether Ms Alagendra may succeed Mr Khan as counsel is subject to the fulfilment of the requirements established in rule 22 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence.
- 6. The Chamber reminds counsel that he remains subject to articles 8, 15 and 17 to 19 of the Code of Conduct. Having regard to article 67(1)(d) of the Statute, the withdrawal of Mr Khan shall only take effect once new counsel has been designated for Mr Gaddafi.

FOR THESE REASONS, THE CHAMBER HEREBY

GRANTS the Request.
