

I. Transmission

1. Pursuant to the “Decision on Prosecution Request for Detention Centre Call Data Related to the Accused and D-6”¹ issued on 2 November 2018 by the Single Judge of Trial Chamber IX, the Registry hereby files in the record of the present case a report relating to communications between witness D-6 and Dominic Ongwen (“the Accused”), containing the following data: (i) the dates and times the Accused communicated with D-6 from his arrival to the ICC Detention Unit until now; (ii) the duration of each communication.²

II. Classification

2. In accordance with regulation 23bis(2) of the Regulations of the Court, the Annex to the present filing which contains the Call Data of communications between Mr Ongwen and witness D-6 is classified as Confidential *ex parte* Defence, Prosecution and Registry only, since it relates to personal communications between the witness and the Accused.
