### I. Introduction

1. The present request to the Republic of Belarus ("Belarus") for cooperation in the arrest and surrender of Mr Omar Hassan Ahmad Al-Bashir ("Mr Al-Bashir") is based on articles 89(1) and 91 of the Rome Statute ("Statute"), in execution of the warrant of arrest for Mr Al-Bashir issued by Pre-Trial Chamber I ("Chamber") on 4 March 2009 ("Warrant of Arrest")¹ as well as the second warrant of arrest for Mr Al-Bashir issued by the Chamber on 12 July 2010 ("Second Warrant of Arrest").²

2. On 28 November 2018, the Registrar was informed of a possible upcoming visit of Mr Al-Bashir to Belarus. The purpose of this submission is to invite the authorities of Belarus to cooperate with the International Criminal Court ("Court") in the arrest and surrender of Mr Al-Bashir, in the event that he would, at any given time, be present on the territory of Belarus.

# II. Procedural history

3. On 31 March 2005, the situation in Darfur, Sudan, was referred to the Office of the Prosecutor of the Court by the United Nations Security Council's Resolution 1593, urging all States to cooperate fully with the Court while recognizing that States not party to the Statute have no such obligation under the Statute.<sup>3</sup>

4. The Chamber issued the Warrant of Arrest for Mr Al–Bashir on 4 March 2009, pursuant to article 58 of the Statute, followed by the Second Warrant of Arrest on 12 July 2010.

5. On 15 April 2015, Pre-Trial Chamber II issued the Corrigendum of "Orders to the Registrar concerning actions to be taken in the case of information relating to travel of suspects" ("Orders"), whereby the Registry is ordered to prepare and transmit a request for arrest and surrender, to be addressed to a State to which no such request has yet been transmitted, when information is received in relation to a potential travel to that State of a person at large who is subject of an arrest warrant issued by the Court.<sup>4</sup>

## III. Applicable Law

6. The following provisions are of particular relevance to the present request for cooperation in the arrest and surrender of Mr Al-Bashir: articles 59, 86, 87(5), 89(1), (2) and (3) and 91 of the Statute, rules 13(1), 117, 176(2), 179, 184 and 187 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence ("Rules"), regulation 31 of the Regulations of the Court and regulation 35 of the Regulations of the Registry. The present request is also submitted in accordance with the Warrant of Arrest, the Second Warrant of Arrest and the Orders.

#### THE REGISTRAR INVITES BELARUS TO:

- arrest and surrender the following person to the Court:

Charges: He is alleged to have committed:

- i) war crimes under article 8 of the Statute
- ii) crimes against humanity under article 7 of the Statute
- iii) genocide under article 6 of the Statute
- comply with the procedures provided for in articles 59, 89(2) and 89(4) of the Statute and rule 117 of the Rules;
- notify the Court of any application made under articles 59(3) and 89(2) of the Statute;
- inform the Registry immediately, pursuant to rule 184(1) of the Rules, when Mr Al-Bashir is available for surrender;
- consult with the Court regarding any information that may be required under Belarus's national law in order to execute the requests; and
- consult with the Court without delay should it identify problems which may impede or prevent the execution of the request.

### THE REGISTRAR TRANSMITS the following documents:

- Copy of the Warrant of Arrest dated 4 March 2009 in its original version;

- Copy of the Warrant of Arrest dated 12 July 2010 in its original version;
- Copies of the two Warrants of Arrest and of the relevant provisions of the Statute and the Rules in Arabic, a language that Mr Al-Bashir fully understands and speaks, for transmission to Mr Al-Bashir; and
- Copy of the Orders.
