## **Background**

1. On 19 December 2018, the Board of Directors of the Trust Fund for Victims (the "Board of Directors") filed the "Notification of the Board of Directors in accordance with Regulation 50(a) of the Regulations of the Trust Fund for Victims of its conclusion to undertake further activities in Uganda" (the "Notification").¹ The Board of Directors identified six assistance projects to be implemented by the Trust Fund for Victims.²

2. On 24 December 2018, the Chamber invited the OPCD, the Defence for Dominic Ongwen, the OPCV, the legal representative of victims in the *Ongwen* case and the Prosecutor to submit observations on the Notification no later than 25 January 2019.<sup>3</sup>

#### **Submission**

3. The Office of the Prosecutor (the "Prosecution") notes that the assistance projects presented in the confidential annex to the Notification were outlined in broad and general terms, targeting groups of individuals who were identified by the Trust Fund of Victims as having suffered harm as a result of the commission of crimes within the jurisdiction of the Court.

4. The projects are aimed at benefiting general groups of victims and not specific victims participating in the case of the *Prosecutor v Dominic Ongwen*. Analysis of the information available to the Prosecution does not suggest that the projects would pre-determine any issue to be decided by the Court, or be prejudicial to or inconsistent with the rights of Mr Ongwen and/or a fair and impartial trial.
