## **I. Introduction**

1. The Registry hereby informs the Chamber of the appointment of Mr Llewelyn Gray Curlewis (“Mr. Curlewis”) as Legal Adviser to Witness D26-P-0032 (“Notification of Appointment”), pursuant to rule 74 (10) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence (“Rules”) in substitution of the previously appointed Counsel, Mr. Michael Donen.<sup>1</sup>

## **II. Classification**

2. Pursuant to regulation 23 *bis*(1) of the Regulations of the Court (“RoC”), the annexes to the present submission are classified as confidential, as they contain personal information and contact details of Mr Curlewis.

## **III. Applicable Law**

3. The Registry has considered the following provisions: article 68 of the Rome Statute, rules 21 and 74(10) of the Rules, regulations 67 and 69 of the RoC, regulation 123(1) of the Regulations of the Registry, and articles 5, 8 and 22(3) of the Code of Professional Conduct for Counsel (“Code”).

## **IV. Submissions**

4. On 18 January 2019, the Registrar appointed Mr Curlewis as the Legal Adviser to Witness D26-P-0032.<sup>2</sup> Mr Curlewis will be duly provided with access to relevant material in connection with the case, including the statements and transcripts of


