I. OBSERVATIONS

1. As the YEKATOM Defence's "Motion for Disclosure of Witnesses with Dual Status"¹ requests Pre-Trial Chamber II ("Chamber") to issue an Order directed to the Registry, the Prosecution provides only limited observations, as set out below. The Prosecution otherwise defers to the Chamber's discretion in the disposition of the Motion.

2. In respect of the Response of the Common Legal Representative of the Former Child Soldiers and the Common Legal Representatives of the Victims of Other Crimes (jointly, the "Legal Representatives") notified earlier today,² the Prosecution confirms its willingness to consult on and/or assist in identifying any dual status individuals.³ The Prosecution concurs with the Legal Representatives in that, in effect, the Motion concerns only the pool of the 15 Group C applicants that the Chamber has thus far authorised ("Group C Participants").⁴

3. Per the information currently available to the Prosecution, of the Group C Participants, six victims are represented by counsel in the Office of Public Counsel for Victims ("OPCV"). None overlap Prosecution Witnesses cited in support of its Document Containing the Charges.⁵ That said, the Prosecution is not yet aware of the circumstances regarding the remaining nine victims who are represented by the other designated Legal Representatives of Victims in the case.⁶
