### I. Introduction

The Registry hereby transmits to the Appeals Chamber ("Chamber") in accordance with rule 13 (1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence the written observations submitted by the Libyan authorities in reply to the "Order scheduling a hearing before the Appeals Chamber and inviting participation in judicial proceedings" ("Order").

#### II. Procedural History

- 1. On 24 September 2019, the Chamber in its Order invited the State of Libya to submit observations, on issues arising from the appeal of Mr Saif Al-Islam Gaddafi against the 'Decision on the "Admissibility Challenge by Dr. Saif Al-Islam Gaddafi pursuant to Articles 17(1)(c), 19 and 20(3) of the Rome Statute'"<sup>2</sup> by 16h00 on 24 October 2019.
- 2. On 23 October 2019, the Registry received the request for extension for submission of observations from the State of Libya in relation to the Order, and transmitted it to the Chamber that day. Also that day, the Chamber in its "Decision on the 'Request for extension for submission of observations from the State of Libya in relation to the Appeals Chamber's Order ICC-01/11-01/11-672'", granted the requested extension of time by 16h00 on 7 November 2019.
- 3. On 7 November 2019, the Registry received 13 documents from the representative of the State of Libya to be transmitted to the Chamber.
