PRE-TRIAL CHAMBER III of the International Criminal Court ('Court') issues this 'Order inviting the Registry to submit observations on the Victims' joint request concerning hearings outside the host State'.

- 1. On 4 August 2019, the Office of the Prosecutor (the 'Prosecution') requested the Pre-Trial Chamber for authorisation to commence an investigation into crimes allegedly committed partially on the territory of Myanmar, partially on the territory of States Parties, including Bangladesh.¹
- 2. On 14 November 2019, the Pre-Trial Chamber authorised the investigation.² In its closing remarks, the Pre-Trial Chamber indicated that it was advisable for the Prosecutor to use the dispositions of Article 56 of the Rome Statute ('Statute') to preserve evidence which may not be available for the purposes of a potential future trial or whose reliability may be undermined by lapse of time.³
- 3. On 7 July 2020, the 'Registry's First Report on Information and Outreach Activities' was transmitted to the Chamber.⁴
- 4. On 4 August 2020, three legal teams representing groups of alleged victims of the situation (the 'Applicants') filed a request concerning hearings outside the host State (the 'Request').⁵ Specifically, the Request seeks a 'Registry assessment of potential venues for the holding of proceedings in a State other than the host State within reasonable physical proximity of the affected population'.⁶

- 5. On 17 August 2020, the Prosecution responded to the Request, opposing it and seeking its dismissal.⁷
- 6. The Pre-Trial Chamber notes that pursuant to Rule 100(2) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence, the Applicants seek an order from the Chamber instructing the Registry to make an assessment on the feasibility of moving the seat of the Court from The Netherlands to, another State party, presumably, Bangladesh.
- 7. Accordingly, and without prejudice to its decision on the merits of the Request, the Pre-Trial Chamber hereby invites the Registry to make observations to the Request no later than 21 September 2020.

FOR THE FOREGOING REASONS, THE CHAMBER HEREBY

INVITES the Registry to file any observations by 21 September 2020.
