1. On 25 November 2020, the Defence filed a request to reschedule the delivery of the article 74 judgment in this case from 12 January 2021<sup>1</sup> to 29 January 2021.<sup>2</sup>

2. On 27 November 2020, the Common Legal Representative for Victims filed a response supporting the Defence request, though emphasising that the judgment should be delivered as soon as practicable and no later than 29 January 2021.<sup>3</sup>

3. On 27 November 2020, the Legal Representatives of the Victims filed a request that delivery of the judgment be postponed until 4 February 2021.<sup>4</sup>

4. In light of the circumstances raised in the requests and in the CLRV response, the support of the victims for a postponement, and the institutional interest of the Court in ensuring that the judgment is disseminated widely, promptly, and accurately to the victims and affected communities, the Prosecution supports the requests for a short postponement of the delivery of the judgment, until at least 29 January 2021 and no later than 4 February 2021.
