In the appeal of Mr Al Hassan Ag Abdoul Aziz Ag Mohamed Ag Mahmoud against the decision of Pre-Trial Chamber I of 27 September 2019 entitled “Decision on the Admissibility Challenge raised by the Defence for Insufficient Gravity of the Case” (ICC-01/12-01/18-459-tENG),

Having before it Mr Al Hassan Ag Abdoul Aziz Ag Mohamed Ag Mahmoud’s appeal brief filed on 21 October 2019 entitled “Appeal of the Pre-Trial Chamber’s *‘Décision relative à l’exception d’irrecevabilité pour insuffisance de gravité de l’affaire soulevée par la défense’* (ICC-01/12-01/18-459)” (ICC-01/12-01/18-475-Conf),

In accordance with article 19(3) of the Rome Statute, rule 59 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence, and regulations 34 and 37 of the Regulations of the Court,

Issues the following

ORDER

1. The victims who have communicated with the Court and who are represented by Mr Doumbia, Mr Kassongo and Mr Nsita Luvengika may present observations on the issues raised in the above-mentioned appeal by 16.00 on Tuesday, 19 November 2019. The victims’ observations must not exceed 10 pages.

2. Mr Al Hassan and the Prosecutor may each respond to the victims' observations by 16.00 on Tuesday, 26 November 2019. The responses must not exceed 10 pages.
3. The State of Mali may present observations on the issues raised in the above-mentioned appeal by 16.00 on Tuesday, 19 November 2019. The observations must not exceed 10 pages.
