THE PRESIDENCY of the International Criminal Court (the 'Court'), in its *ad hoc* composition consisting of First Vice-President Robert Fremr, Second Vice-President Marc Perrin de Brichambaut and Judge Olga Herrera Carbuccia, notes that the Appeals Chamber is currently seized of an appeal against acquittal in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Laurent Gbagbo and Charles Blé Goudé* (the 'appeal' and 'case', respectively);<sup>1</sup>

The Presidency notes that on 20 and 21 January 2021, respectively, it was seized of administrative requests from the Presiding Judge in the case, Judge Chile Eboe-Osuji, and Judge Howard Morrison concerning the extension of their respective mandates for the purpose of the completion of the appeal in the case (the 'Requests').

The Presidency notes that, pursuant to article 41(2)(a) of the Rome Statute and rule 33(1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence, Judge Eboe-Osuji was excused from the Presidency for the purpose of the latter's consideration of the Requests due to the evident risk of a lack of impartiality were Judge Eboe-Osuji to be involved in decision-making connected to his own request.

The Presidency notes its responsibility, pursuant to article 38(3)(a) of the Rome Statute, for the proper administration of the Court, with the exception of the Office of the Prosecutor.<sup>2</sup>

The Presidency hereby provides notification that, by way of internal administrative decision of 28 January 2021, it granted an extension of mandate to the aforementioned judges until no later than 31 March 2021 for the purpose of completing the appeal.
