## I. Introduction

1. The Registry hereby transmits to Trial Chamber IX (“Chamber”) in accordance with rule 13 (1) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence , one document, entitled “Brief and Priority Needs” (“Submission”), which it received on 7 June 2021 from Lanam Stella Angel (“Ms Angel”), Director of War Victims and Children Networking.

## II. Procedural History

2. On 6 May 2021, the Chamber issued its “Order for Submissions on Reparations”.<sup>1</sup>
3. On 7 June 2021, the Court Management Section (“CMS”) received an e-mail from Ms Angel, including Ms Angel’s Submission on behalf of the War Victims and Children Networking, which did not comply with the ICC filing format requirements.<sup>2</sup>
4. On the same day, the CMS contacted Ms Angel requesting her to change the Submission to comply with the ICC format requirements.<sup>3</sup>
5. The CMS did not receive any response from Ms Angel.
6. On the same day, the CMS contacted the Chamber<sup>4</sup>, seeking advice on whether it could proceed with the registration of the Submission as received. By way of e-mail the Chamber instructed the CMS to register the Submission in the record of the case through a Registry transmission filing<sup>5</sup>.


