## I. INTRODUCTION

1. The Prosecution hereby notifies Trial Chamber I ("Chamber") of the disclosure of evidence pursuant to articles 64(3)(c) and 67(2) of the Rome Statute, and rules 76(3) and 77 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence ("Rules").

## II. CLASSIFICATION

2. This filing is classified as public with one confidential Annex. Confidential Annex A contains a list of evidence that has been disclosed to the Defence.

## **III. SUBMISSIONS**

- 3. On 6 August 2021, the Prosecution disclosed to the Defence Pre-Trial INCRIM package 67, consisting of five items (42 pages) that have been identified as containing incriminating evidence. Of these, three items (DAR-OTP-0220-0688, DAR-OTP-0220-0703 and DAR-OTP-0220-0718) were already disclosed to the Defence via email on 21 July 2021 since they also contain information material to the preparation of the Defence pursuant to rule 77 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence and/or subject to article 67(2) of the Rome Statute.
- 4. Among these items was one witness statement (six pages).
- 5. With respect to redactions, the Prosecution has followed the procedure for exceptions to disclosure that was adopted in this case by the Single Judge of Pre-Trial Chamber II on 17 August 2020.<sup>1</sup> Accordingly, all of the redactions fall under the "standard" category of redactions to disclosure under rules 81(2) and 81(4) of the Rules as contained in the Chambers Practice Manual.<sup>2</sup> The redactions that have been applied are minimal and affect neither the substance
