- 1. On 21 September 2021, Ms Amal Clooney filed submissions on legal representation of victims (the 'Ms Clooney Submissions').¹
- 2. On 1 October 2021, upon instruction of the Chamber,² the Registry filed a report on common legal representation (the 'Registry Report').³
- 3. On 4 October 2021, the Chamber instructed the legal representatives of victims to provide information as follows:
 - a) Whether all victims (presently participating and future victims) could be represented by Ms Wistinghausen and Mr Nasser acting as one single team.
 - b) Whether Ms Wistinghausen and Mr Nasser wish to continue representing victims participating in this case on a *pro bono* basis.
- 4. On 5 October 2021, the Defence responded to the Registry Report.⁴
- 5. On 8 October 2021,⁵ the Office of Public Counsel for Victims (the 'OPCV') filed its submissions⁶
- 6. On that same date, Ms von Wistinghausen submitted observations on behalf of victims who wish her to replace Ms Clooney. The Chamber notes however that since Ms von Wistinghausen has not been appointed as counsel, the Registry did not file her observations in the record of the case.⁷
- 7. Mr Nasser Mohamed Amin Abdalla did not file any response.⁸
- 8. The Chamber notes that Ms Clooney stated, *inter alia*, that 'she does not seek appointment in the team of common legal representatives for victims during trial or in

any other phase of the case'. She also informed the Chamber that victims she represented accept that Ms Clooney should be replaced by Ms Natalie Wistinghausen. 10

- 9. The Chamber regrets that Ms Clooney simply informed the Chamber as a *fait accompli*, that she had withdrawn from the case and had found a replacement. Irrespective of the reasons for her withdrawal and the professional qualifications of Ms von Wistinghausen, pursuant to Article 16(3)(a) of the Code of Professional Conduct for counsel, permission of the Trial Chamber must be sought in advance.
- 10. The Chamber further notes that although Ms Clooney in her submission asserts that 'there is no gap in legal representation for victims' 11 and that victims have agreed to the replacement of counsel, until such time as Ms von Wistinghausen is appointed as counsel she cannot officially file submissions before the Chamber. The Chamber notes that although Ms Clooney stated that she intended to take up her new duties on 15 October she did not respond to the Chamber's request.
- 11. The Chamber also deplores the fact that despite its clear instructions, ¹² counsel have not answered the specific questions asked by the Chamber. The Chamber emphasises that unless any conflict between victims emerges, in the interests of justice, efficiency and resources only one team will be appointed to represent the interests of victims at trial. The Chamber therefore instructs Ms Massidda, Ms Wistinghausen and Mr Nasser Mohamed Amin Abdalla, to indicate by 14 October 2021, whether they are willing to represent <u>all victims</u> (presently participating and future victims) acting as <u>one single team</u>, pursuant to Rule 90(2) of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence. If the answer is in the affirmative, then counsel should decide among themselves who will act as lead counsel and inform the Chamber accordingly by the same deadline.
- 12. For the present, to avoid a further gap in legal representation, and in order to enable her to make submissions on the issue of common legal representation, the Chamber authorises the appointment of Ms von Wistinghausen as legal representative.
