EXPERTISE AS REQUSTED BY THE PRESIDING JUDGE

APPLICANT'S EXPERTISE

The Applicant, is a former Justice of Appeal of the Court of Appeals of Uganda, now renamed the Supreme

Court of Uganda, with considerable experience as a prosecutor and judge in Uganda, and a former Lecturer-in-

Law at Columbia University Law School, in New York since 2001, specializing in African Law and an expert in

international law following over 20 years working in the International Civil Service, first as Deputy Director in

the Office of Legal Affairs of the United Nations and General Counsel of the African Development Bank.

In connection to Applicant's request to submit an Amicus Brief on the legal issues raised, Applicant worked as a

senior prosecutor in the Department of Public Prosecution of Uganda from 1966 to 1972 representing the State

before the High Court of Uganda in criminal cases, including cases of Murder in which the insanity defence was

in issue, as well as on appeal to the Eastern African Court of Appeal. From 1974 to 1978 , Applicant served as a

Judge of the High Court and of the Court of Appeal hearing and Issuing Judgments in Criminal Cases in which again the issue of Insanity and Diminished Responsibility was in issue. As a Prosecutor I worked very closely

with expert Psychiatrists called to testify in court and as a Judge had to decided cases in which expert evidence

involving mental capacity was in issue.

From 1981 to 1996 I was a member of the United Nations Office of Legal Affairs, as Deputy Director, and

gained vast experience issuing legal opinions addressing various fields of International Law. Following my

retirement in 2000 from the African Development Bank, I have continued to work as a Senior Consultant to the

United Nations especially in the field of the United Nations Peace Keeping operations. I would mention that I

hold an LLB(Hons) from London University and LLM From Columbia University specialising in International

Law and Jurisprudence. I have since 2001 to 2019 been a Lecturer in Law at Columbia University teaching

African Legal Theory, Law and Development. During this time I have taught a course on Transitional Justice

and published article on this subject. I also have followed closely the case of Dominic Ongwen and other cses

before the ICC, and the UN International Criminal Tribunals, ICTY and ICTR as well the mixed court in Sierra

Leone.
