I refer to your call for expressions of interest as amicus curiae in judicial proceedings relating to the case of the Prosecutor vs Dominic Ongwen (document reference ICC-02/04-01/15 A).

I am a forensic psychiatrist by profession, and have extensive experience in working with criminals. In addition, I have worked as a physician in war zones such as Mozambique, Honduras and Afghanistan. As a psychiatrist in a nationwide Dutch trauma clinic, I gained a lot of experience with psychiatric treatment of war-related traumatized asylum seekers and refugees. Among them I have regularly treated traumatized child soldiers from different African countries.

My remarks will focus on the evidentiary issues related to mental illness or mentally deficient development. In my experience, traumatic events are more damaging to children and adolescents than to - presumably more balanced - adults. Such events can lead to a serious negative impact on basic trust, ultimately resulting in severe attachment disorder. The latter can lead to skewed personality development manifested in deteriorated cognitive abilities, emotional imbalance and dysregulated behavior.

While a post-traumatic change to a safe and predictable environment can lead to mental and behavioral improvements, continued exposure to an unsafe and unpredictable environment, on the contrary, can lead to chronic dysfunctionalities, for example, chronic post-traumatic stress disorder. In addition, it can lead to deficient personality development, sometimes described as post-traumatic personality disorder.

Since every patient is different and I have not examined Dominic Ongwen myself, it is impossible for me to give a specific diagnosis about his current and former mental situation. However, it is quite possible that as an individual exposed from such a young age and for such a long time to an environment such as within the LRA, he may have developed disorders such as those mentioned above.


