**TRIAL CHAMBER III** of the International Criminal Court, in the case of *The Prosecutor v. Paul Gicheru*, having regard to Article 64(2) of the Rome Statute (the 'Statute'), issues the following 'Order Setting Deadline for Defence Requests'.

- 1. On 18 March 2022, the Chamber issued an order, instructing the Defence to inform the Chamber and the Office of the Prosecutor of its intent 'to present evidence or not' by 25 April 2022.<sup>1</sup>
- 2. On 25 April 2022, the Defence filed a 'Notice of Intent Not to Present A Case' (the 'Notice').<sup>2</sup> On the same day, following the notification of its Notice, the Defence also filed an application to introduce evidence other than through a witness (the 'Bar Table Motion').<sup>3</sup>
- 3. The Chamber understands the Notice not to present 'a case' as the Defence's notification that it will not be presenting a case through the calling of witnesses. However, the Chamber interprets the Defence's Bar Table Motion as that it still intends to tender evidence into the record.
- 4. In the interests of ensuring the expeditiousness of the proceedings, the Chamber hereby instructs the Defence to file any further motions upon which it wishes the Chamber to rule, by no later than 4 May 2022.
