Pursuant to Trial Chamber V's Decision ICC-01/14-01/18-1406 dated 13 May 2022, this document is reclassified as Public.

I. PROCEDURAL HISTORY

- 1. On 9 May 2022, the Prosecution requested Trial Chamber V (the "Trial Chamber") to direct the Registry to identify and appoint counsel as necessary pursuant to rule 74 of the Rules of Procedure and Evidence to advise witness P-2475 on self-incrimination, and to assign the Common Legal Representative of Victims to provide this advice with respect to the dual status witness P-2582 (the "Request").¹
- 2. On the same date, the Trial Chamber shortened the deadline for the parties and participants to respond to the Request to 12 May 2022.²
- 3. On 11 May 2022, the Defence for Mr Yekatom filed a response to the Request.³
- 4. On the same date, the Defence for Mr Ngaïssona and the Common Legal Representatives of Victims of Other Crimes informed the Trial Chamber that they did not intend to respond to the Request.⁴

II. SUBMISSIONS

- 5. The Common Legal Representative of the Former Child Soldiers (the "Legal Representative") hereby submits his response to the Request,⁵ insofar as it concerns the dual status individual P-2582.
- 6. In accordance with the Initial Directions, "[u]nless otherwise ordered by the Chamber, the CLRV shall provide [...] advice for dual-status witnesses [who may be at risk

of incriminating themselves during their testimony]".6 The Legal Representative submits that he is best placed to provide to his client, dual status individual P-2582, legal advice regarding the risk of her self-incriminating on account of her testimony, and informs the Trial Chamber that he is available to do so accordingly.

III. CLASSIFICATION

7. Pursuant to regulation 23bis (1) and (2) of the Regulations of the Court, this response is filed confidentially to correspond to the classification of the Request. However, since this response does not contain any confidential information, the Legal Representative is of the view that it can be reclassified as public.
